WEBINAR DESCRIPTION

“The *comparability of qualifications* seems to be best possible if NQFs are described in terms of *learning outcomes*: Against this background, it should not surprise that the descriptors of the European Qualifications Framework (EQF) – planned to be something like a “translation machine” between national qualification frameworks in Europe – also refer to learning outcomes.

In the light of these processes, *assessment* is getting an increasing role: If ways to achieve learning results have to be neglected as they are too different in order to be taken in account in the context of comparing qualifications, it becomes important that *learning outcomes* are really comparable in *practical terms* since the same kind of understanding success and failure with regard to achieving these learning outcomes rules their consideration.

At first glance, this is not a requirement that causes many difficulties: Assessment has always measured *the results of learning* and thus the *assessment of learning outcomes* is not a totally new approach, even if this term has not always been used in national environments. However, it cannot be claimed that assessment does basically not raise problems in the context of debates on qualification frameworks: It has to be considered that assessment approaches, even if applied on the same learning outcomes, nevertheless can differ considerably in terms of the *way how assessment is carried out* and this could lead to the assumption that a learning outcome is not always understood the same way everywhere.”


TARGET GROUP
